California Agency Efforts



Residential Energy Rebate Programs (HOMES/HEERA)



State Lead

- California Energy Commission (CEC)

\$8.8 Billion National Funding

- \$582 million in formula funding for California

HOMES program

- Performance-based rebates for whole-house energy saving retrofits
- Rebates vary by amount of energy savings

HEEHRA program

- Point-of-sale rebates for qualified electrification projects in LMI households
- Electric heat pumps and electric stoves



Climate Pollution Reduction Grants (CPRG)



State Leads

- California Environmental Protection Agency (CalEPA) and California Air Resources Board (CARB)

\$5 Billion National Funding

- \$250 million noncompetitive planning grants
 - \$3 million for California
- \$4.6 billion competitive implementation grants
 - Applications due March 2024

- California historic leadership in emissions reductions



Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund (GGRF)



State Lead:

- California Infrastructure and Economic Development Bank (IBank)

\$27 Billion National Funding

- \$14 billion National Clean Investment Fund competition
- \$6 billion Clean Communities Investment Accelerator competition
- \$7 billion Solar For All competition





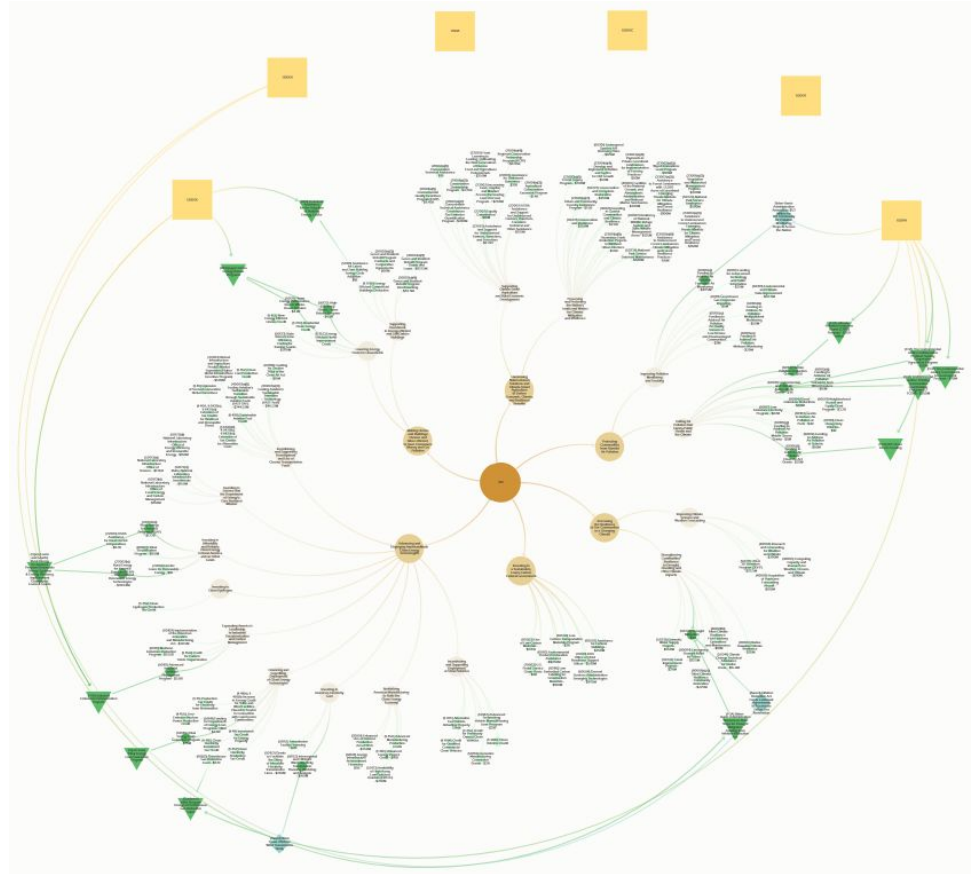
